Simple Syrup of wormwood, in Latin, Syru pus abiynthii fimplex.

Take of the juice of common wormwood clatified, of Sugar clarified each four pound, make a Syrup; the fame way are prepared the fimple Syrups of the juice of Bettony, Borrage, Buglofs Carduus Benedictus, Camoniel, Succory, Endive Hedge Muftard, Strawberries, Fumitory, Groundivy, St. John's-wort, Hops, Mercury, of the frefit tops of Moufear, Plantain, Apples, purflain, Rafpberries, Sage, Scabious, Scordium, Houfleek, Coltffoot, Speedwel, and of other juicesthat are nor acid.

Virtues. Syrup of wormwood is good to strengthen the Stomach, to stop vomiting, and for a dropsy.

Dose. Half an ounce of it may be taken at a time.

Honey Medicines, and Medicines made of Honey and Vinegar, in Latin, Melita & Oxymelita.

Mercurial Honey, in Latin, Mel Mercuriale.

Take of the juice of Mercury three pints, of Honey two pound, clarifie and boil them to the confiftence of Honey.

Virtues, It is used in Glifters.

Honey of Mulberries, in Latin, Diamoron.

Take of the juice of Mulberries, of the Tree and Shrub gathered before they are ripe, and before the Sun is up, and cleared by ftanding, each a pint and an half, of ftrained Honey clarified two pound, boilt The London Dilpeniatory. 45 oil them to a due thickness in a Bath. Virtues. It is commonly used for inflamations, and we mouths.

Honey of Rofes, in Latin, Mel Rofarum.

Take of Red Roles not full blown two pound, f the best Honey fix pound, fet them in the Sun acording to art.

Virtues. It is used to heal ulcers of the mouth and broat.

Simple Oxymel, in Latin, Oxymel fimplex.

Take of the beft Honey two pound, of the clearft water three pints and an half, boil the Honey and Water in a glazed earthen pot, fcuming of it continually with a fpoon that hath holes; add by degrees one pint of White Wine Vinegar, boil it over a gentle fire to the confiftence of a liquid Syrup.

Virtue. It cleanses ulcers of the Lungs; it may be taken with a Liquorice stick.

Simple oxymel of Squills, in Latin, oxymel Scilliticum Simplex.

Take of clarified Honey three pound, of Vinegar of Squills a quart, boil them according to art.

Virtues. It is very cleanfing and healing to the Lungs, and helps expectoration; it is a gentle vomit, but is most commonly given with other things.

Dofe. When you defign to vomit with it, you may give two ounces of it at a time, when it is uled for obftruction. of the Lungs, it is beft to mix half an ounce of it with two ounces of fome pectoral Syrup, as with Syrup of Liquorice, Maiden hair, or the like.

Oxymel Julianizans.

Take of the bark of Capper roots, of the roots of Orris,-Fennel, Paríly, Kneeholm, Succory, Alparagus, Cyperus, each half an ounce, of the Herbs, Hartf-tongue, Tamarisk, Schenauth, each half an handful, of the feeds of fweet Fennel half an ounce, infufe them in Vinegar and water, of each a pint and an half, afterwards boil away half, ftrain it, and with clarified Honey and Sugar, each half a pound, make a Syrup of the thicknels of Honey.

Virtues. This opens obstructions, is good for difeases of the Lungs, and Hypocondriack Melancholly, and for the Rickets, it also forces Urin.

Dife. Two or three ounces of it may be taken at a time.

Rob, or Sapa.

Rob of Berberries, in Latin, Rob de Berberis.

Take of the juice of Barberries strained one pint, of white Sugar half a pound, with the gentle hear of a Bath, boil them to a due thickness.

Virtues. It quencheth thirst, cools and strengthens the stomach, and procures appetite.

Juice of Liquorice, in Latin, Succus Glycyrrhizæ Simplex.

Take of Liquorice Roots well cleanled, and gently bruifed, as much as you pleafe, infufe them three days in Fountain water, fo much as may rife three fingers breadth above them, then boil it a little and prefs itour, afterwards boil it with a gentle heat to the due confiftence of a juice.
