Descent of Sir HUGH COURTENAY: from Evidences.

Reginald de Courtenay, came into England in the reign of Hen. II. Ob. 4 Ric. I, buried in the church of Ford abbey. = Hawise de Abrincis.

Robert de Courtenay. Ob. 26 Hen. III, buried at Ford. = Mary de Redvers.

John de Courtenay. Ob. 1 Edw. I. buried at Ford. = Isabel de Vere, sister of Hugh earl of Oxford.

Hugh de Courtenay, the first of the name of "Hugh," which he doubtless received from his maternal uncle. Ob. 19 Edw. I, buried at Cowick, near Exeter. = Eleanor de Spenser.

Hugh de Courtenay, the first earl of Devon of this family. Ob. 14 Edw. III, buried at Cowick. = Agnes St. John.

Hugh de Courtenay, second earl of Devon, born 12 July 1303. Ob. 2nd May 1377, buried in Exeter cathedral. = Margaret de Bohun, married 11th Aug. 1325.

Sir Hugh de Courtenay, one of the Founders of the Order of the Garter; born 22nd March 1326-7. Ob. vitā patris, buried at Ford before the 2nd Sept. 1349.
